


Damson Class



One of the highlights was trying their hand at archery, learning how to safely use a bow and arrow to aim at targets. After all that action, it was time to gather around the campfire for a classic treat – toasting marshmallows. The children listened carefully to fire safety instructions before roasting their marshmallows to golden perfection and enjoying a warm, gooey snack. The session was a wonderful opportunity for the children to build confidence, develop new skills, and connect with nature – all while having fun with their friends.

Two enthusiastic pupils took part in an exciting **Mini Triathlon** event, designed especially for primary school children. The event included a short **run**, a **bike ride**, and a **fun water activity** – giving everyone the chance to challenge themselves while having lots of fun! Well done Harley and Georgie!

Pupils from Oak had the exciting opportunity to take part in a canoeing session at Debdale. For many children, it was their first time on the water – and they absolutely loved it! After a safety briefing and getting kitted out with life jackets and paddles, the children climbed into their canoes in groups and set off on the water. They learned how to steer, paddle in rhythm, and work as a team to navigate the course. There were lots of laughs, a few wobbles, and some impressive paddling skills on display! As well as having fun, the children showed great resilience, confidence, and teamwork – all key learning goals for the day.

Pine and Oak enjoyed an action-packed trip to **Flip Out**, and it was a day full of energy, fun, and fantastic memories! As soon as the children arrived, they were eager to get bouncing. After a short safety briefing, they explored the huge trampoline areas, foam pits, climbing walls, obstacle courses, and more. Pine Class

This term in Pine Class, we have been learning about the artist Alexander Calder, who is famous for creating wire mobile sculptures of faces. The children explored how he used wire to create expressive, three-dimensional drawings in the air. They showed great resilience while bending and shaping the wire, which required patience and problem-solving. Using techniques such as twisting, looping, and attaching wire carefully, they created their own face sculptures inspired by Calder's unique style.

This term in Pine Class, the children visited Debdale Water Park, where they had the exciting opportunity to try kayaking. They learned how to use paddles correctly to steer and move through the water, developing their coordination and balance. The children worked together brilliantly, supporting and encouraging one another throughout the session. It was a fantastic experience that helped build their confidence, teamwork, and resilience. They thoroughly enjoyed being out on the water, and many said it was one of the best parts of the term.

This term in Music, we have used the glockenspiel and learned a range of new skills. The children developed their ability to read and follow simple musical notation, create their own short note patterns, and play them confidently. They also practised listening carefully to each other, so the whole class could follow and repeat the notes in time. Through this, they built their coordination, rhythm, and memory skills. The children have made fantastic progress and have achieved the ability to compose and perform short sequences as a group.
















Rowan Class


