Raising attainment in swimming to meet requirements of the national curriculum before the end of Key stage 2.	Three weekly swimming lessons to be shared equally between Withington and Longsight.	£7,400 45%	All classes throughout the Key stages go to swimming lessons on alternate half terms. Swimming distances, badges and lengths are recorded by swimming coaches. Contributes towards the pupils one hour of PE a week and recommended 30 minutes of physical activity a day.
Assess impact of swimming and see if three weekly lessons are beneficial to the pupils. Review data on Swymphony. Gather data overtime to review the impact at Y6 and the numbers of children achieving the Y6 expectations in swimming.			
Embedding physical activity into the school day through active playground and active teaching.	School playground markings to be costed and added to the playground at Longsight.	£1000 6%	School playground to marked out with pitch and markings for games.
Next steps – permanent play equipment in yard for example: hoops on walls.
